

## Tecumseh shuts out Ben Logan 5-0.

In their fourth CBC match of the season, the Tecumseh Arrows boy's soccer team travelled north to Logan County on September 16th to play the Raiders of Benjamin Logan High School. The Raiders have struggled against league opponents this year and the Arrows were no different. From the opening kickoff, Tecumseh was on the attack and dominating possession. Though they were in total control, the Arrows were slow to score. With 7:13 remaining in the first half, Tecumseh was awarded an indirect free kick in the penalty box. Arrows junior Cameron Fritschie passed the ball to sophomore Joel Summerfield on a quick restart. Summerfield smoothly knocked it passed the goalie to drive the Arrows into a 1-0 lead.

In the second half, the Arrows picked up right where they left off. This time the goals came more quickly. After 7 minutes of play, sophomore Jordan Gozelski passed a nice through ball to Fritschie who dribbled the ball briefly before firing it into the goal. Four minutes later, Fritschie returned the favor and crossed a ball to Gozelski who headed it into the goal for a 3-0 lead.

As the game was winding down, senior Cory Wiley scored his first goal of the season on a loose ball in front of the goal and Fritschie added one more on a direct kick to give the Arrows their final score of 5-0. The Tecumseh defense was so stifling that senior keeper Jacob Heckman was only required to make one save in the game.
