

## Tecumseh earns 7th shutout at Stebbins.

The Tecumseh boy's soccer team rolled through Stebbins High School's Edmundson Stadium like a Mack truck on Wednesday, October 7th. The Stebbins Indians (3-10-0, 3-6-0 CBC) have struggled this season and are having particular trouble with the Kenton Trail division of the Central Buckeye Conference. The Arrows (10-3-0, 7-2-0 CBC), however, are proving to be among the CBC elite as they have demolished one league opponent after another. If Stebbins had hoped to pull off an upset on this night, the Arrows were quick to dash that expectation.

Senior captain Zach Schwartz opened the scoring by converting a penalty kick after less than 3 minutes of play. In fact, Schwartz went on a rampage and scored three goals in the first 11 minutes and 35 seconds of the game. The second and third goals came courtesy of assists from the sophomore duo of Jordan Gozelski and Joel Summerfield. Throughout the game, Tecumseh seemed to be on cruise control and the goals began to rack up.

With 6:35 remaining in the half, junior Sam Studebaker scored his first goal of the season when fellow junior Taylor Gill sent a through ball down the left sideline. Studebaker rushed past the defenders to win the ball and fired a shot into the near side of the goal to give the Arrows a 4-0 lead.

Several minutes later with only 46 seconds remaining in the half, senior Aaron Seebeck scored his first goal of the season. Seebeck dribbled the ball through the defensive line near midfield and simply outran the defenders on his way to goal. The goalie came out and Seebeck coolly drilled the ball into the far side of the goal. At halftime, the Arrows led 5-0.

In the second half, the Arrows experimented with some different lineups and the scoring slowed considerably. Gozelski was in the right place at the right time and tapped in a rebound to increase the Arrows score to 6-0 with about 19 minutes left and Schwartz capped his evening with his 4th and final goal of the game with 10 minutes remaining. The Arrows won by a final score of 7-0 and increased their number of shutouts this season to seven. Tecumseh is just one shutout shy of the school's regular season record of eight and they still have two games remaining before tournament play begins.
