The Eastern Lacrosse Conference met in the North Eastern Ohio Conference room on Monday and came out on the long end of an 8-0 score. The Lacrosse teams were in the conference room and were not able to let go against their non-conference opponents on this day. Earlier in the week they played a close 2-1 decision against their main GOC North Eastern foe in the first place and had they were ready for the rest.

The Arow came into the match short on key personnel to injury and had to rely on younger players to step up their game in order to compete. The game plan for Eastern was simple.
